
Adult & Children's Religious Exploration

Earth Advocates Corner

Earth Advocates was formed in response to concerns about global climate change and increasing risks to environmental sustainability. The threats are real and



immediate. Locally, we have seen more frequent and severe wildfires, extraordinary drought conditions, and extreme weather events leading to floods and mudslides. Impacts elsewhere are even more severe, often affecting the most vulnerable communities the hardest. Scientists affiliat-

ed with the United Nations have clearly stated that we have until 2030 to reduce our carbon emissions by 45% or face even greater environmental disasters than we have experienced in the recent past. That leaves us just six-and-a-half years to achieve this goal. New research also shows that global animal populations are declining more rapidly than previously believed, and some scientists argue that human activity has set off the world's sixth mass extinction event.

An Invitation to the Juneteenth Block Party!

Juneteenth Santa Barbara is a local celebration of the national recognition of Black Independence Day. It is a collaborative effort to showcase Black culture, talent, and joy in Santa Barbara County. This event, now in its sixth year, centers on a free community block party that will be held in historically Black Santa Barbara, now known as the Funk Zone. With a theme of "Nourishing the People," the free community block party will honor the cultural connection of Black/African-American food and the ancestral ties to our community.

Earth Advocates' mission is to educate, inspire, and take actions toward ending the climate emergency and promoting ecological sustainability. Our goals are to empower individuals within our congregation, change facilities and practices as needed, and advocate throughout the Santa Barbara community.

While this can sound both frightening and over-whelming, scientists also tell us that if we take rapid and sustained actions, we can stave off the worst impacts. Earth Advocates was formed to help our congregation do our part to attain this goal. We will provide information and tools to help us all work toward ending the climate emergency and adopt practices that allow us to tread more lightly on the Earth. We are committed to leading our congregation to make necessary changes in our awareness and behavior and ask you to join with us in creating a more hospitable world for our generation and generations to come. Together we can make a difference.

Look for us during the coffee hour at our courtyard table, where we will provide ideas on how to reduce our carbon footprint and adopt more sustainable practices. Watch for us in future *Kaleidoscope* issues where we will discuss issues of concern, and you can also follow us on Realm. Come and talk to us about your concerns, offer us your suggestions or sign up to be a volunteer. *June Outreach Offering*Showers of Blessing

Showers of Blessing provides free hot showers, fosters compassionate hygienic care, and offers access to critical services for people experiencing homelessness. Every week, Showers of Blessing drives a shower

trailer to five established sites in Santa Barbara and Goleta. With each shower, their guests receive a freshly laundered towel and wash-



cloth, a pair of new cotton socks, a pair of new underwear, hygiene items, and limited emergency clothing. Showers of Blessing also offers guests companionship, conversation, and contact with other homeless service providers. Their services are entirely free and access is unconditional to all people who are without a house or are in temporary or unstable housing.
